

Ways to share learning with families

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01. Verbally

When talking with families during drop off and pick up make sure to share how the child has been engaging with the curriculum and the progress that they are demonstrating.

02. Documentation

When writing up your observations or your daily diary make sure to highlight the learning with the language that you use. Avoid hiding the learning behind codes and symbols that families are unlikely to understand.

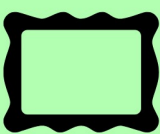


03. Newsletters

Whether in newsletters, emails, or your programming app, you can use general communication to discuss how children learn through play and ways you support this through your environment.

04. Social media posts

Many services utilise social media to share insight into their operations and as a way to market their organisation. Don't forget to highlight the learning that occurs and how you value and embed this in your practices.



05. Displays

When creating displays around the service this is a great opportunity to share the learning that occurred during the experience.
