Accepting children for who they are	Often we feel pressure to make children into a societal expectation of what they should be instead of allowing children to be who they are and celebrating this. This webinar explores how to achieve this.
Advocating on the child's behalf	Sometimes when making decisions in the service we base them on the needs of the adults, however it is important that educators speak up on behalf of the children and their needs to make sure they are considered.
Attachment: Creating a sense of security	This recorded webinar explores attachment, how to support attachment and how to ensure families are supported in their role around providing a secure base for their children.
